## **35<sup>th</sup> Annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Service**

The 35<sup>th</sup> Annual National Peace Officers Memorial Service will be held on the West Front of the U.S. Capitol at 11:00 a.m. on Sunday, May 15, 2016. This ceremony honors the law enforcement officers who were killed in the line of duty.

### **Street Closures & Bus Restrictions:**

On Sunday, May 15 beginning at 12:01 a.m., the streets listed below near the West Front of the Capitol will be closed to vehicular traffic. These streets will re-open at 5 p.m.

- First Street NW/SW between Constitution and Independence Avenues
- Pennsylvania Avenue, NW, from First Street, NW, to Third Street, NW
- Maryland Avenue, SW, from First Street to Third Street

Tour buses will be rerouted to Third Street, SW/NW at Maryland Avenue, SW, and Third Street, at Pennsylvania Avenue, NW, for drop off and pick up on Sunday, May 15.
