PURPOSE

The purpose of this Industry Day is to provide potential vendors with information regarding upcoming projects, contracting opportunities, and anticipated requirements. MISSION

Protect the Congress - its Members, employees, visitors, and facilities - so it can fulfill its constitutional and legislative responsibilities in a safe, secure and open environment.



WHO WE ARE

The USCP is a federal law enforcement agency in the United States with nationwide jurisdiction charged with protecting the United States Congress within the District of Columbia and throughout the United States and its territories. It answers to the Capitol Police Board and is the only full-service federal law enforcement agency appointed by the legislative branch of the federal government of the United States.

The USCP has the primary responsibility for protecting life and property, preventing, detecting, and investigating criminal acts, and enforcing traffic regulations throughout a complex of congressional buildings, parks, and thoroughfares. The Capitol Police has primary jurisdiction within buildings and grounds of the United States Capitol Complex. It also has concurrent jurisdiction with other law enforcement agencies, including the United States Park Police and the Metropolitan Police Department of the District of Columbia, in an area of approximately 200 blocks around the complex. Officers also have jurisdiction throughout the District of Columbia to take enforcement action when they observe or are made aware of crimes of violence while on official duties.

USCP CONTRACT GUIDANCE

It is important to note that USCP **does not** operate in the same contractual guidelines as the Executive Branch. USCP is not bound by the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR). However, it serves as a guide for many of our policies, processes and procedures.

USCP does not have set aside programs. However, we have competitive requirements soliciting on SAM.gov and utilize various contract vehicles, including GSA, and NASA SEWP.

In addition, Sole Source contracts and Class Justifications are utilized when appropriate.

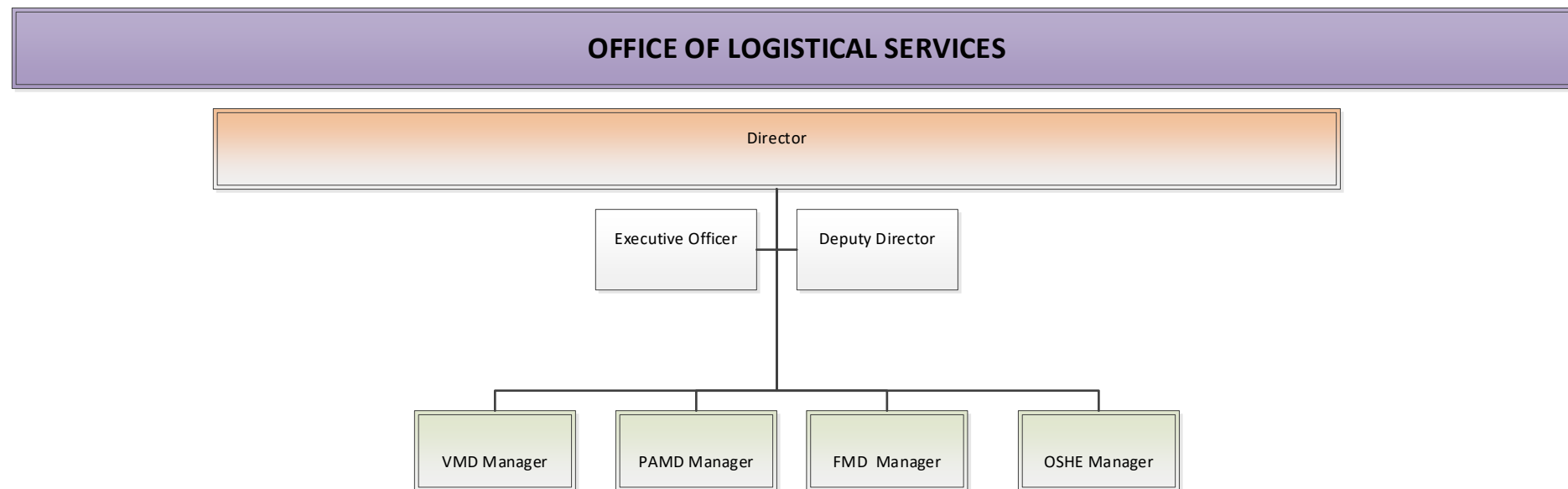

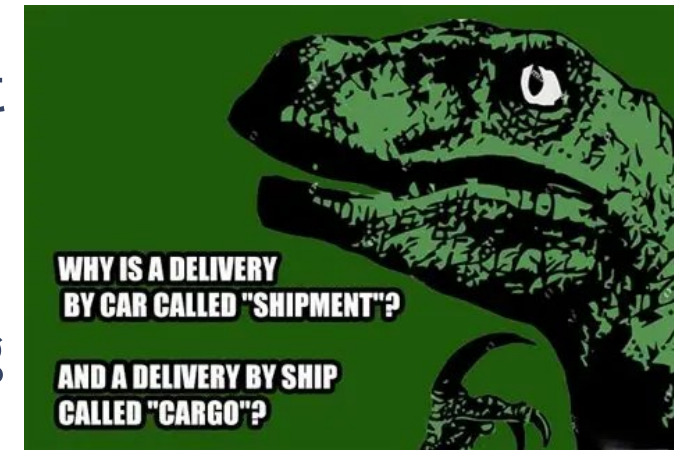


OFFICE OF LOGISTICAL SERVICES

- Manages centralized logistical operations including warehousing, shipping and receiving, uniform and equipment issue
- Leads budget planning, contract oversight as the Contracting Officer's Representative, and strategic advising to senior leadership

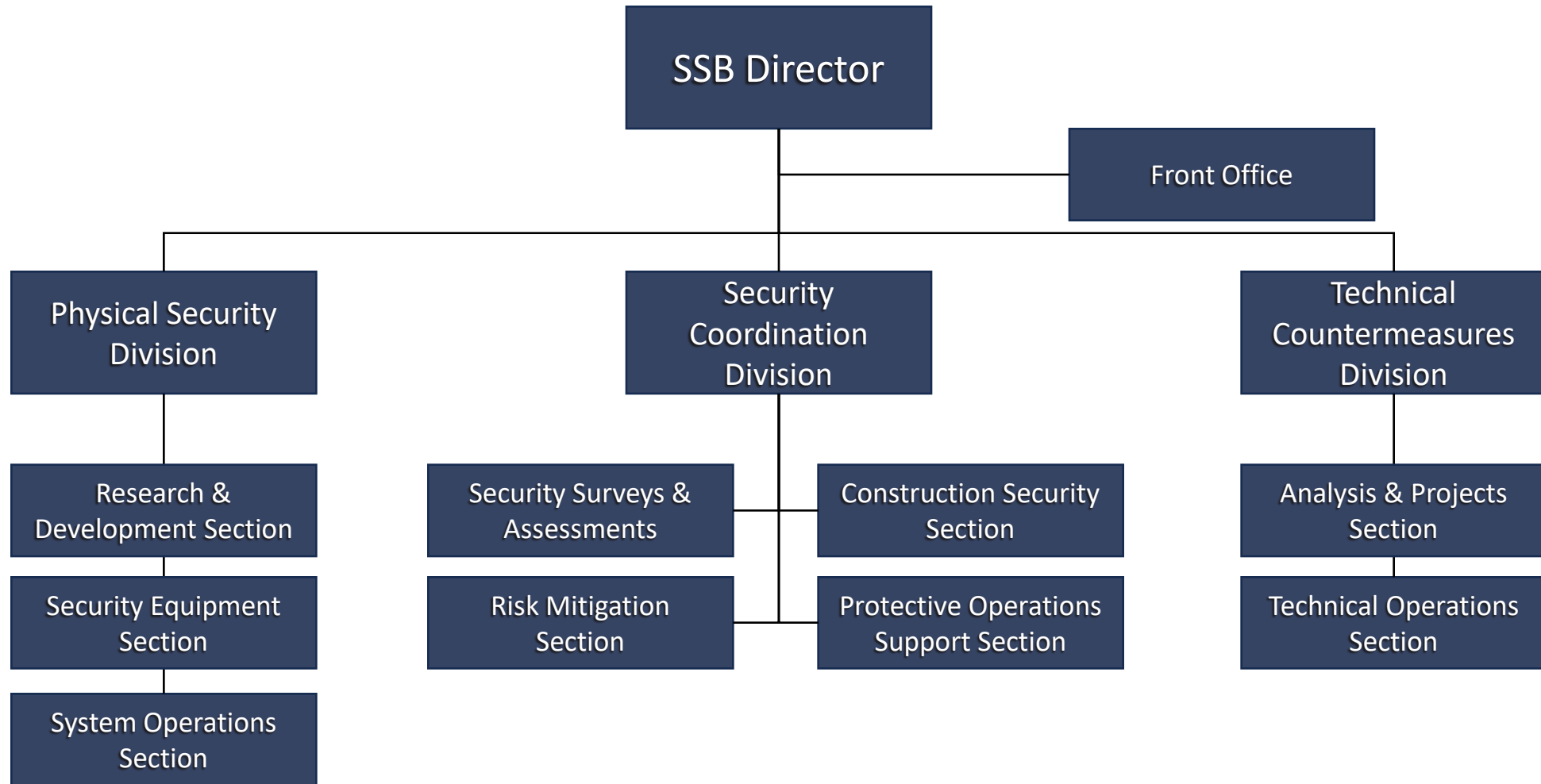

SSB ORGANIZATIONAL CHART



PHYSICAL SECURITY DIVISION

- Establishes Physical Security standards and guidelines for the design, installation, and maintenance of all physical security equipment, systems, and network applications, to include:
 - Access Control
 - Intrusion Detection
 - Duress
 - Closed Circuit Video
 - Security Screening
 - Perimeter Security
- Researches and identifies emerging, available, or applicable technology for testing, acquisition, integration and advancement of USCP physical security capabilities
- Manages the system design, acquisition, installation, maintenance, and lifecycle of all security systems, equipment, and materials protecting Members of Congress, Employees, and Visitors at Congressional sites and facilities, and in support of remote and special security events
- Oversees the extensive network supporting the security systems and applications by administering, configuring, maintaining, and ensuring the security and integrity of the overall security network for the Capitol Complex



SECURITY COORDINATION DIVISION

- Protects Members of Congress on the Capitol Complex and in Member Districts by providing security assessments, inspections, and analysis of vulnerabilities to facilities, offices, and homes
- Recommends countermeasures to mitigate threats to the campus in coordination with other elements of the Department and external agencies during Congressional security events and National Special Security Events (NSSE) such as:
 - Congressional Delegations (CODEL) and Protective Details
 - First Amendment Marches and Demonstrations
 - Concerts at the Capitol
 - State of the Union Addresses
 - Presidential Inaugurations
 - State Funeral Services
- Work closely with the AOC to plan construction site security and logistics to ensure a secure work environment while maintaining access for vehicles and pedestrians
- Integrates elements of the Interagency Security Committee (ISC) Risk Management Process (RMP) in the development of security policies and the implementation of the Department's Security Education and Training Awareness (SETA) program



TECHNICAL COUNTERMEASURES DIVISION

- Helps protect the U.S. Capitol Complex, its personnel, and its operations from covert technical surveillance threats. The Division works to ensure that Members of Congress and their staff can conduct official business in secure, trusted environments.
- Using specialized equipment and highly controlled techniques to identify and addresses potential electronic surveillance risks that could compromise sensitive or classified information.
 - Detects and neutralizes electronic surveillance devices targeting sensitive or classified information
 - Applies technical countermeasures to isolate and mitigate surveillance threats
 - Manages the convergence of TSCM and TEMPEST disciplines
 - Conducts technical vulnerability assessments as part of a broader, layered security approach
 - Coordinates with Intelligence Community partners on technical security issues and threat trends
- Provides expert guidance to Congressional offices on recognizing and reducing exposure to technical threats.
 - Provides education and awareness on emerging technical threats and best security practices



MISSION PARAMETERS AND NEEDS

- Parameters

- SSB has built assessment driven processes to drive our technological needs and work closely with partner agencies to share information on evaluated or deployed technologies
- SSB Divisions routinely participate in technical events such as ISC West or reach out to capabilities vendors to find technological solutions, as needs are identified
- Please limit direct contact with the Government to responses to official requests for information

- Needs

- SSB is currently looking at FY'28 technology solutions, pending budgetary reviews and appropriations
- Focus for this FY will be person and vehicle screening for non-fixed applications. Examples of for consideration:
 - Mobile Truck and Vehicle Screening
 - Vehicle Verification / Access Controls
 - Mobile or Weather Resistant X-ray screening capabilities
 - Rapid Perimeter Detection Sensors (Camera, Alarm, Access Control)

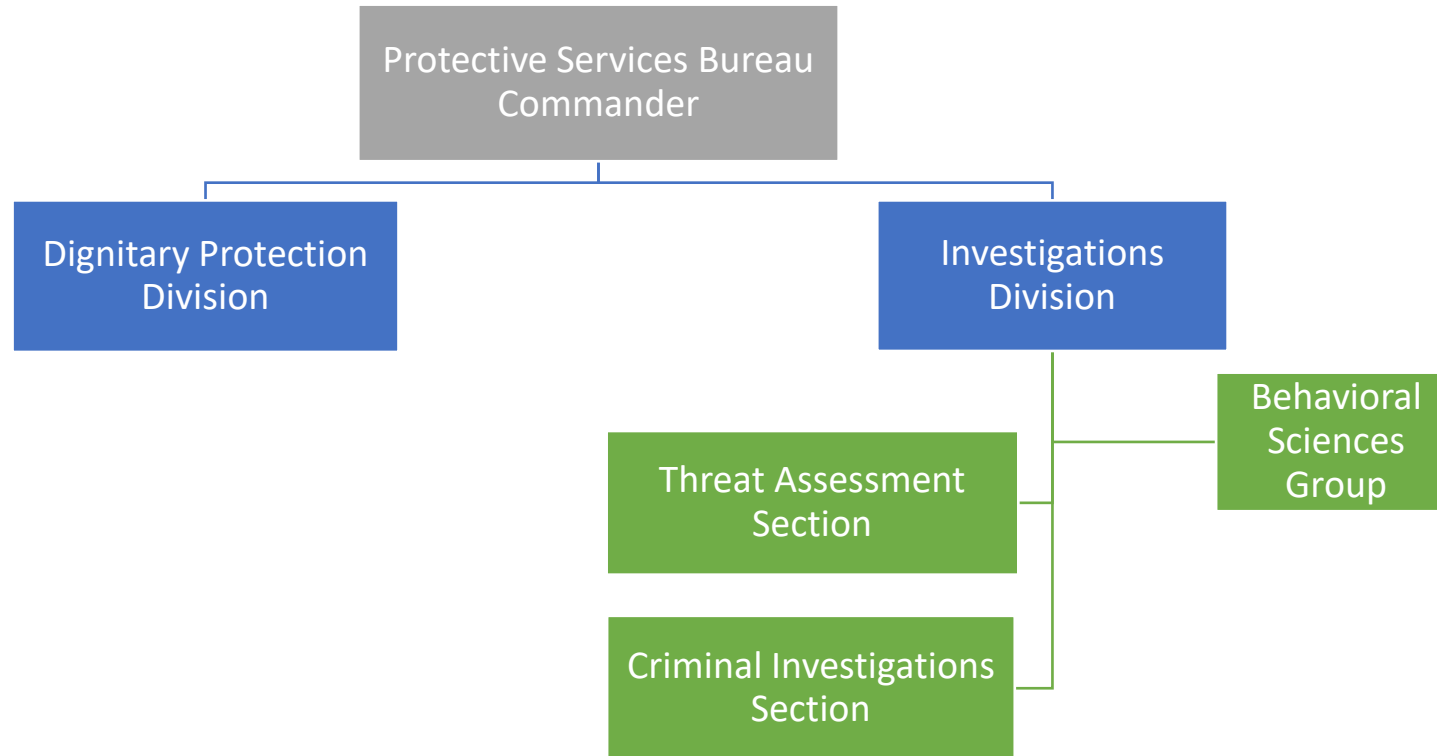
PROTECTIVE SERVICES BUREAU (PSB)

MISSION

- To provide safety and security to the Capitol, Members of Congress, Officers of Congress, and their immediate family.
- Investigates, collects, and analyzes information to assess threats, enforce the law, identify risks, and develop and employ risk mitigation and enforcement strategies.

PSB - Investigations Division (ID)

ID-THREAT ASSESSMENT SECTION (TAS)

MISSION

- USCP TAS was founded in 1986, as one of the first law enforcement agencies to have a dedicated threat assessment unit
- Prevent acts of targeted violence toward USCP protectees and protected properties by receiving, assessing, and mitigating reports of problematic/concerning behaviors directed toward USCP protectees/properties
 - TAS is main repository for all reports of threats and/or concerning/unusual directions of interest toward USCP protectees
- In 2025, TAS received approximately 15,000 case leads, which require investigation, assessment, and management (short-term and/or long-term)
 - Low threshold of reporting: Early reporting aids early intervention for issues that may escalate in a negative manner.



ID-TAS BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES GROUP (BSG)

Consultation

Support threat assessment process for cases with a behavioral or mental health nexus:

- Provide insights related to assessment strategy, interview approach, and management planning
- Offer support ranging from in-depth case consultations to informal check-ins

Research Initiatives

Launch a dedicated research program to:

- Better understand behavioral threats specific to our setting
- Focus resources where they are needed most
- Identify training gaps to continuously improve education for agents and protectees



ID-TAS BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES GROUP (BSG) (CONTINUED)

Partnerships

- Actively expanding our program through international partnerships, conferences, and research to stay at the forefront of threat assessment

Training

- Expand and create training so we can continuously develop skillsets for our agents and educate our protectees
- Continuously refine our processes based on feedback and industry comparison to best serve agents and the USCP mission



INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION (ID)

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS SECTION (CIS)

MISSION

- Conduct follow-up investigations of criminal acts, within our jurisdiction, and involving stakeholders of the USCP
 - Identify/interview/apprehend offenders
 - Recover lost/stolen property
 - Protect victims' rights
 - Coordinate the collection of evidence for court presentation
 - Disseminate investigative information with USCP stakeholder impact
 - Manages the Department's juvenile interactions





UNITED STATES CAPITOL POLICE

PSB - Dignitary Protection Division (DPD)

DIGNITARY PROTECTION DIVISION (DPD)

MISSION

- Protect Members of Congress, leadership, and designated dignitaries
- Conduct advance operations for official travel and events
- Maintain secure transportation and movement operations
- Support contingency and continuity of government planning and response



DPD (CONTINUED)

DPD Protective Operations

- Provide Protective details assigned to Congressional leadership and threat based protective details
- Coordination with local, state, and federal law enforcement
 - Includes on-site security, and motorcades for protective details
 - OCONUS protective coverage and coordination



DPD (CONTINUED)

DPD Protective Operations, continued

- Integration with other Capitol Police divisions to provide a comprehensive protective environment, both on the Hill and beyond
 - Congressional CODELS: Site surveys/assessments, Credentialing, Perimeters, Screening, Command Posts, Emergency actions
- Provide secure vehicle operations and motorcade management
 - Protective movements for CODELs and leadership travel
- Airport escort coordination



DPD (CONTINUED)

Protective Equipment and Technology

- Vehicle fleet
- Emergency medical kits
 - AED, Trauma Medical Kits
- Communications and Command Post coordination on the road
- Weapons systems for protective operations
- Specialized daily-carry equipment for protective agents



DPD (CONTINUED)

Training and Readiness

- We partner with TSB to conduct our own protective operations and firearms training
- Basic Agent Training Program and in-service
 - Protective operations
 - Advance site planning
 - Emergency vehicle operations
 - Medical response and tactical casualty care
 - Scenario-based exercises and contingency drills
 - Leadership and communication development



PSB FUTURE CONSIDERATIONS

In an evolving and expanding threat/protective environment, PSB must adapt to meet that challenge. To do so, future growth and expansion would include:

- Growth of the size and role of the Behavioral Science Group and investigative support
 - Increase usage of analytical tools and capabilities
- Growth of the size and scope of the Dignitary Protection Division with escalation of event coverage and the protective mission
 - Effective management/administration tools to assist with growth/expansion
 - Specialized equipment to enhance our capabilities

EMPLOYEE SUITABILITY DIVISION (OBIC-ESD)

MISSION

Our mission is to support the congressional community, public safety, and organizational integrity by conducting thorough background investigations for law enforcement officers, professional staff, and contract personnel, while recruiting and selecting the most qualified law enforcement officers through a comprehensive hiring process that includes targeted recruitment, application review, qualifications assessments, interviews, background investigations, suitability evaluations, and final selection. Through professional screening and hiring practices, we help ensure a trusted, capable, and USCP mission-ready workforce.



OBIC OVERVIEW

Employee Suitability Division

- Manage all applicants-Sworn and Professional Staff.
- Personal engagement to better inform applicants and build relationships.
- Seamless application process with the ability to continuously evolve to meet the needs of the applicants.

Badging and Credentialing
